I'm sad to tell you that this will be my last Binsey letter. As some of you may have heard, I am moving on from the post of Team Vicar for Binsey.

I am grateful for many kindnesses and friendships I have experienced, and for the sublime context of the beautiful Lake District. Both, I trust, will endure.

Begging the pardon of Tolkien, The Lake District, is really The Shire, rather like Hobbiton's, fictional dwelling of the Hobbits in *The Lord of the Rings*. The good humour, hospitality, and neighbourliness Bridget and I have experienced is similar to Tolkien's allusions to his happy childhood in the Warwickshire countryside which inspired his books. The Cumbrian dialect is something precious too - 'as gam yam!' And almost as impenetrable to me as the languages of Tolkien's, Middle Earth peoples.

I think most people have in their mind's-eye a fuzzy view of our rural counties - but the reality is tinged with the harsher realities of life that all humans encounter. Tolkien was deeply impacted by the Great War, no doubt the germ for his hordes of evil and engines of destruction spewing from Mordor.

The countryside has its own challenges, such as recession, viruses, strained infrastructure, losses, rising prices, many types of rain at any time of year. But there are many gains alongside the grief and joys. There are glorious vistas, new-born lambs and calves in season, birdsong, abundant greenery, and a calm pace of life, excellent local produce and delights - real ale and cheese, charming villages, shops [not enough] and delicious cakes. I've certainly enjoyed a few cheese scones with the occasional coffee.

So, thank you. Enjoy our green paradise and remember me with good thoughts. - I will do the same.

England win! (At last)

Since the last edition of the Binsey Link, England has won a major football tournament, the European Cup; the first major international football trophy since 1966. The national England football team beat Germany in the final (without going to penalties!). The women's team, of course.



Throughout their matches England played with an optimistic determination, a creativity and an enjoyment of their play despite the pressures they were under, despite being at times outplayed by both Spain and Germany. They rarely argued with the referee. It was all very refreshing to watch.

The team was full of individual talent. There was the reliable Mary Earps in goal, who even managed to see the humour of the situation after a desperate goal mouth scramble before she could securely hold the ball. There was Beth Mead dribbling past

defenders as if they were rooted to the spot. There was the calm presence of the captain, Leah Williamson in defence, with her confident runs forward. There was Keira Walsh, delivering exact and precisely timed passes that allowed others to score, despite opponents attempting to mark her out of the march. There was, of course, the 'supersubs' such as Alessia Russo with her back-heeled goal that surprised everybody (perhaps even herself!). The list could go on.

But, of course, most important of all they brought these individual skills to play as a team. The team would not have been a team without their individuality but their individuality would not have been expressed or developed without being in a team. It seemed clear from both on the pitch and the celebrations afterwards that they liked and respected each other.

Likewise, it might be said the Binsey Mission Community is a team, consisting of people from twelve churches and one chapel. We have a 'Team Rector', Stephen. Sadly Peter has just left us, so we no longer have a 'Team Vicar'. So now, perhaps, we have to plan for the future as a team. Each congregation within the team have a unique individuality or identity. The team would not be the team without them but our present and future ability to express and develop our Christian identity needs a team.

We are facing challenges, but hopefully we too can show an optimistic determination, a creativity. There is one difference between the England football team and the Binsey Mission Community. The England team had to achieve the victories they won. Our victory has already been won. The life of Christ, his mission, his death and resurrection reveal what is always true. The love, the acceptance, the compassion of God are always with us. The challenge is not to achieve God's love but to accept and live it.

May that love continue to motivate and inspire us.

Book Review

Small Pleasures by Clare Chambers.

Small Pleasures was long-listed for the 2021 Women's prize for Fiction and featured on BBC's Between the Covers. It is a historical romance set in 1957 with an interesting twist at the end.

A journalist on a local newspaper, Jean Swinney seems trapped in life of duty and drudgery without much expectation of escape. She lives with her aging and demanding mother as the daughter left behind, her sister having left for an exciting life overseas. Jean's quiet life is thrown into turmoil when one day a young woman contacts the newspaper claiming her daughter is the result of a virgin birth. Intrigued and desperate to find something to focus her interest on, Jean begins an investigation with the aim of discovering whether this is a miracle, a fraud or a misunderstanding.

The path of Jean's investigation makes up the main narrative of this novel. The closeness she finds with the family at the heart of it, leads her dangerously close to a glimpse of happiness she could barely conceive of before embarking on this journey of discovery. Although it seems like a mistake to her at times, Jean is inexorably drawn to this small family group and finds herself pulled into dark waters where she never imagined herself to be.



I thoroughly enjoyed this novel. It's an easy read and yet well written with a simple but effective story-telling style. It gives a realistic glimpse into life in the 1950's for both men and women. The relationship of the main character with her manipulative house-bound mother gave much food for thought and discussion. Although I won't give the plot away, the main love interest in the story was refreshingly 'ordinary'. No Love Island beauties or smartly-dressed, wealthy business owners with flashy cars. Just realistic people experiencing realistic emotions.

The ending? Well...that's debatable. Very debatable. It caused a great deal of discussion amongst my reading group. Read it and see! Feel free to let me know your views!
