Autumn

This summer, I have been able to enjoy some holiday and do plenty of walking in Scotland and the Yorkshire Dales as well as here on the Cumbrian fells. In Britain we know that we are very fortunate to have such a variety of landscapes and the freedom to enjoy these beautiful settings.

In Binsey, we wake up each day to the wonderful back-drop of the fells and the Scottish hills across the Solway, alongside the daily reminders of the wonder of nature in our gardens and all around us.

Inevitably, the changing of the seasons and the moving from summer to autumn and then to winter, brings a different rhythm and routine to life. Some find that change more challenging and especially the winter months themselves. Yet, whilst the arrival of autumn means that winter is around the corner, it also signals that spring is not too far away again as creation goes through this natural cycle of change. We enjoy the

fruits of creation in summer and into autumn before there is a resting period, and spring brings re-growth and new life.

I'm aware that it might be said I have entered the 'autumn' of my earthly life and those of us, who are getting older wish this natural cycle of life could be repeated in us, so the unwelcome aspects of older age could be changed and our bodies renewed!

Yet, from a Christian perspective this cycle of life shows the hand of God at work and is a sign of the transformation and new life that he wants to bring to each of us through the love of Jesus Christ.

There are some things in life that we can do nothing to change, but God looks to come alongside each of us in his son, Jesus Christ, to bring purpose and meaning at whatever stage of life we have reached. God's love supremely demonstrated in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, is a constant reassurance that whatever changes happen in

our lives and in the world around us, his love will never change.

We would love to welcome you into our church and help you make your life-long commitment to each other before God.



Book Review


The Marriage Portrait by Maggie O'Farrell

Having been an English teacher for a very long time, I found myself teaching the same poems repeatedly. Some I loved; some I definitely didn't! One that I did love was Robert Browning's 'My Last Duchess' so when I heard that one of my favourite authors (remember Hamnet?) was writing a fictional back story to the poem I was excited and intrigued. This is historical fiction at its best. Full of bustling detail injecting life into the pages and putting flesh onto the dusty bones of a past so distant we can barely imagine it.

Florence, the 1550s. Lucrezia, third daughter of the grand duke, is comfortable with her obscure place in the palazzo: free to wonder at its treasures, observe its innermost workings, and devote herself to her own artistic pursuits. But when her older sister dies on the eve of her wedding to the ruler of Ferrara, Modena and Reggio, Lucrezia is thrust unwittingly into the limelight: the duke is quick to request her hand in marriage, and her father just as quick to accept on her behalf.



universally welcomed. Perhaps most mystifying of all is her new husband himself, Alfonso. Is he the playful sophisticate he appeared to be before their wedding, the aesthete happiest in the company of artists and musicians, or the ruthless politician before whom even his formidable sisters seem to tremble?



This is a novel full of surprise. It makes a stark comparison with the way we treat children today and shines a light on the expectations of both women and men at the time. Maggie O Farrell seems to have an incredible talent for bringing the past to life in a real and emotional way so that the reader can feel a genuine attachment to the characters. I felt so protective of Lucrezia; I cheered when she triumphed and feared when she was under threat. This is a book I couldn't put down...and although I had read the poem it's based on, there's certainly no need for prior knowledge. O'Farrell's rich tapestry of language leads you and entices you through a bewitching story. Don't miss it.



School News

Ireby

Hello and welcome to a new school year here. The two pupils who left us in the summer are settling into their new learning environment at Keswick School and we have welcomed new starters in to our Early Years unit. As well our pupils moving up through the school into new classes, three of our teachers will be teaching different classes this year so plenty of new beginnings and changes to get used to. We congratulate Mrs Salmons (Miss Jackson) as she has returned to school having got married over the summer break. Many congratulations Hannah! This year our youngest pupils, Nursery and Reception (Early Years / Foundation Stage), will be taught by Ms Hartwell in Binsey Class. Year 1 and 2 (Key Stage 1), our Whinlatter Class, will be taught by Mrs King, and Year 3-6 (Key Stage 2), will be taught by Mrs Salmons and Mr John in Skiddaw Class.

This term in Binsey Class, the topic is "All About Me" where the children will explore and identify a range of different feelings and learn to understand how to express and control them. This new term will also be about building awareness of rules in the school and classroom, gaining knowledge in how to stay healthy and build relationships with classmates and staff. This half term our school Christian Value is Friendship so the whole school will be focusing, discussing, and exploring the roles of families and friendships. Whinlatter Class will be thinking about this big question in RE - "Is it possible to be kind to everyone all of the time?" In Science, Binsey Class will be focusing on minibeasts and habitats and looking at the season of Autumn. Through our Woodland Wednesday afternoons with Whinlatter Class too, the children will be looking very closely at seasonal changes that happen at this time of year. This term Whinlatter Class will be visiting Watchtree Nature Reserve to support their science topic of investigating living things and their habitats. Topics in Skiddaw Class this term will include learning about the Stone Age, Iron Age and Bronze Age in Year 3 and 4, and the Tudors in Year 5 and 6. In computing through the school Year 1 and 2 will be working to improve their mouse skills, Year 3 and 4 pupils will be exploring networks. The children are all currently busily practising their and the internet and Year 5 and 6 will examine the Microbit. To find out more about the learning here at Ireby School, please have a browse through our school website to see how Mr John and the staff have been developing a strong, challenging and creative curriculum that is tailored to Ireby but also incorporates exciting and enriching outdoor learning opportunities. You will also see what activities and visits have been enjoyed by the pupils throughout the year.
