CHILDHOOD MEMORIES

All of us have significant memories of our childhood, and in some way those memories can become stronger as we get older or rather, they are the memories that we don't forget. Sometimes, we can forget what we did last year, but we retain strong memories of growing up for whatever reason.

Thankfully, many of us hold very happy memories of our childhood days and of growing up in a time when many things were different to this current time.

In early February, the village of Torpenhow (where I live) held an Exhibition about the more recent history of the village and local people were invited to share photographs and memories from the past. It was fascinating to seeing those pictures and particularly a short cine recording from 1966 along with hearing memories and recollections from those, who have lived here for all or most of their lives.

Probably a reasonable number of you reading this article will have grown up in these villages of West Cumbria, but there will be plenty of you, who have moved here in more recent years. I spent my early childhood in Ollerton, which is in North



Nottinghamshire. In those days Ollerton was a mining and farming community and Ollerton Colliery was at the heart of the community. Many of the men worked down the pit or had worked there. The women tended to do seasonal work such as potato picking on the local farms or worked at the local hosiery factory, which was just outside Ollerton.

All of this meant that most of the people living in Ollerton had grown up together, and now worked alongside one another. Therefore, a very strong sense of community was forged through these shared and common bonds, which held people together.

Much has changed in Ollerton since I was a child and most significantly the Pit closed in 1994, which was devastating blow to the whole community. Likewise in our villages here, there has been plenty of change over the past 50 years and in general people no longer both live and work alongside one another. Therefore, despite the smallness of these places, people no longer know everyone who lives in their village.

We cannot turn back the clock and recreate the past, but we all have opportunities to support local organisations and events, and so play our part in helping to build a proper sense of community.

God created us to relate well to each other and to share in community life together, exemplified by Jesus instructing us to love and care for one another because in doing such things we are also showing our love for him.

Visitors to St Bega's

Will anyone find this little church, in the middle of a field, a mile from the main road? During 2023 over 1700 people did (and that does not include all those who do not sign the visitors book).

Where do they come from? Besides folk from all over the United Kingdom, people came here from: Australia, Austria, Canada, Cyprus, Finland, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Jersey, New Zealand, Norway, Romania, Singapore, The Isle of Man, The Netherlands, The United States and Uruguay.

Why do they come? For some it is a surprise found by accident on a pleasant walk. Others return like John & Mary who 'enjoy our 21st year of visiting this blessed place.' And a visitor from Wolverhampton says it is 'my favourite spot in England.'

Yet others have a very special reason for coming. Many come to remember their marriage here. And this church is particularly precious to Jenny who writes: 'My husband Fr John Musther was ordained as orthodox priest here in 2009. He died in February 2023. May his memory be eternal. He greatly loved this beautiful church.' That was an important moment in the history of St Bega's as it was the age of the church (predating the Great Schism between the Orthodox and Roman Catholic churches) which made this ordination possible.

What do people find here? 'Balm for the soul', 'indeed a thin place to know God's love', 'never fails to move us', 'Peace, Prayer, Praise, Perfect'.

A couple from Salisbury wrote 'this is our 4th visit, we love it and have been using the Binsey Team Ministry prayer sheet each night. Today we have come to get a replacement sheet with many many thanks.'

Whether they have walked St Bega's Way (thoroughly recommended by one group 'the guide book is excellent') or in any other way, may they too find 'Balm for the soul.'



Book Review

Fingersmith by Sarah Waters

I first read this novel many years ago. I loved it so much I forced most of my friends and family to read it too...even my sister who, at the time, had a toddler and a new born. And she finished it. That's how much of a gripping read it is! So when it was suggested that we read it for our Binsey Book Club I resolved to read it again. I wondered if it would stand up to a second read. I was not disappointed. If a classic novel can be defined as one that has never finished what it has to say, then this is a modern classic. Nominated at the time for many big awards, this novel packs a real punch and keeps the reader desperate to read on. It's a book that calls to you from your bedside. A book that whispers to you from your bag..."Go on. Just another chapter. You know you want to'.

Sue Trinder is an orphan, left as an infant in the care of Mrs. Sucksby, a "baby farmer," who raised her with unusual tenderness, as if Sue were her own. Mrs. Sucksby's household, with its fussy babies calmed with doses of gin, also hosts a transient family of petty thieves—fingersmiths—for whom this house in the heart of a mean London slum is home.



One day, the most beloved thief of all arrives—Gentleman, an elegant con man, who carries with him an enticing proposition for Sue: If she wins a position as the maid to Maud Lilly, a naïve gentlewoman, and aids Gentleman in her seduction, then they will all share in Maud's vast inheritance. Once the inheritance is secured, Maud will be disposed of—passed off as mad, and made to live out the rest of her days in a lunatic asylum.

With dreams of paying back the kindness of her adopted family, Sue agrees to the plan. Once in, however, Sue begins to pity her helpless mark and care for Maud Lilly in unexpected ways...But no one and nothing is as it seems in this Dickensian novel of thrills and reversals.

The plot thickens over and over again. You'll find yourself marvelling at how you didn't see that coming. Read it and immerse yourself in a world so brilliantly conjured by a writer of mammoth talent, and you will never see the world in quite the same way again. This novel explores sexual politics, female sexuality, identity, nature vs nurture, the cruelty of humans and love against the odds. It certainly tackles topics I've never really read about in any other 'Victorian' novel and although you come to realise that some rather risqué material is being discussed, the writing stays firmly on the right side of tasteful and makes it all the more compelling to read.

Waters leaves a lot to the imagination...so I suppose it all depends how vivid your imagination is!

Black Lion Community Group Update and Share Launch

Our main work has been writing our business plan and share prospectus getting the figures right so that they should satisfy the shareholders, and the bodies that we hope will award us funding.

To this aim we are intending to launch our share offer on April 15th . This will be at a priority event specifically for local people who have expressed interest and support for our aims. There will be an initial presentation, and then the steering committee will be able to talk to you and answer any further questions.

Approximately 2 weeks later shares will be released to the wider public on Crowdfunder.

Shares are priced at £1, with a minimum purchase of 50. This will entitle you to a vote at meetings. We hope that this low cost will encourage as many people as possible to become members. We also hope, and many of you have indicated, that a significant number of you will buy shares in larger quantities. The Share Prospectus will be available in printed form, with FAQs. Isel/Bridekirk First Responder Group

As most readers will be aware the Community First Responder (CFR) scheme is a volunteer based country wide scheme, overseen in this area by the North West Ambulance Service (NWAS). All CFRs are fully trained in heart resuscitation, oxygen administration and other basic life saving skills. This buys time for the patient whilst an ambulance is in transit to the scene. We are re-assessed every year and have regular monthly training sessions. There are also e-learning modules to be completed annually. At present there are 9 active CFRs in our group who cover an area which includes the whole of the parishes of Isel, Bridekirk, and Setmurthy, i.e. between Tallentire, Castle Inn, Higham and Cockermouth, along with several outlying properties in these areas. Every responder has a telephone 'App' so that they can be paged by NWAS when required. Normally, we would expect to respond to 30 - 40 calls each year, however, over the year 2023, our responders have attended a lower than usual number of 22 incidents. Most of the equipment we carry has to be purchased by ourselves. Funding for this is raised by the 150 club scheme. Unfortunately the number of people contributing to this has dropped over the last couple of years. Despite the drop, our financial situation remains healthy and is expected to cover any new spending required for the coming year. Thanks must go, not only to our active responders, but also to our secretary, treasurer and 150 club administrator without whom the group would struggle to function. However, we will be making sure that the graves are kept mown and tidy but not, of course, until all the Spring bulbs have died down. It will be interesting to see what new growth appears, and whether we attract other small animals apart from our resident Red Squirrels – and, of course, the mice that eat the Frontals!

School News

Ireby

It is wonderful to be surrounded by signs of Spring in farmers' fields, in our gardens and of course here in our school playground. Last week the Nursery and Reception children (still wrapped up warm!) went for a walk through Ireby to look for and describe as many signs of Spring as they could see. It is wonderful to be able to get out and about on foot to explore our local environment, but we are also so fortunate to have our own minibus. This half-term, a few examples of where we have been in it include - weekly swimming lessons, a cross-country event at Netherhall, a dodgeball event in Keswick, a trip to explore the course of the River Cocker and a trip to carry out a traffic survey in Wigton. The EYFS pupils went to Wigton to carry out a traffic survey from the middle of the town as part of their Transport topic and then they learnt how to complete a tally chart with their results when they were back in the classroom. The Year 5 and 6 pupils had a trip to Wigton too recently to carry out their own experiment. At the Wigton Baths, they conducted a science experiment to investigate whether sound travels through water. Using a sound source at one end of the pool, pupils submerged at 2 metre intervals and counted what they heard. Their results were recorded and taken back to school to be analysed. Back in the classroom, also as part of studying sound in science, they have been using technology to film clips to explore how sometimes you need to slow things down to help you observe. Discussions generated from this were fantastic. These clips and many other examples of our trips, activities and experiments in our classrooms are frequently uploaded to our Twitter account (now known as X) @IrebyCESchool. I highly recommend having a look at what we get up to – you can join our 430 followers! The pupils (and staff!) all embraced World Book Day last week. The costumes were fabulous, varied and original and were an example of just how much joy and inspiration the children here get from books and stories, form Nursery up to Year 6. To end the day, the children all came together and some of the older children retold and acted out a few of their favourite traditional stories to everyone. There were some very talented performances! If you've walked past Ireby School recently, you may have noticed a big white clothing bank that is located just inside the school gates. This has been organised by our PTA to help raise extra funds for the children at Ireby. Please donate your pre-loved clothing and shoes by placing your items in a bag and posting them inside. Unfortunately, the PTA had to take the decision to cancel the Cheese and Wine Night last month but please keep your eyes open for upcoming events on our school Facebook page or on village noticeboards. A reminder that our Easter Service is on Thursday 28th March at 10am at St. James's Church followed by the traditional Egg Dump back at school. Everyone at Ireby School wishes everyone a very Happy Easter and we look forward to the Summer Term starting back on Tuesday 16th April.

TRAFFIC MATTERS Concerns have been raised by a number of members of the public about the speed of traffic on the C2064 through Embleton Village and on to Lambfoot where there is a significant density of houses, and pedestrians/cyclists moving around without safe pedestrian infrastructure, and the need for the speed limit to be reduced further from the 40mph limit that is currently in place, and that traffic calming measures are

also required to encourage traffic to obey any reduced speed limits.

HIMALAYAN BALSAM is an aggressively invasive weed. A single plant can set about 800 seeds. The mature seed capsules react to the slightest disturbance, causing the seed pod to split, then curl up and twist explosively, projecting the contents up to 7m (more than 20 feet) away. The black, round seeds remain viable in the soil's seedbank for about 2 years. They are buoyant and can travel long distances along waterways to infest new areas, even germinating under water. The plant is easy to cut before flowering, but cutting is only effective if made very close to the lowest nodes, near ground level. Small infestations can be controlled by hand pulling, as the plant is shallow rooted. For more information, go to www.phlorum.com




