### WALKING

For those of us, who are fortunate enough to live here in this beautiful part of Cumbria, then we have the benefit of plenty of enjoyable places to walk. Often, we don't have to drive very far to reach one of the fells or lakes, or we can walk from home instead -around the village and the surrounding countryside.

Walking is an activity that people of all ages can enjoy, and it doesn't require any specialist equipment, other than a good pair of shoes or walking boots, and suitable clothing for the Cumbrian climate, especially an effective waterproof coat! Walking is always something that we have done as a family, especially here in the Lake District, where we holidayed for many years, and now we can enjoy walking here all the time.

A number of recent health studies have highlighted the benefits of walking for our physical and emotional well-being, such as increasing cardiovascular fitness; strengthening bones and muscles; reducing body fat; improving our mental health by reducing stress; and increasing energy levels.

There are further emotional and spiritual benefits of walking as well. Perhaps, as the recent periods of lockdown demonstrated, it is good for our sense of well-being to be outside and in the fresh air. It gives us a greater appreciation of the beauty, variety and wonder of nature as we enjoy the sights, smells and sounds all around us, particularly at this time of year with all the flowers in bloom, and the birds singing.

Hopefully, walking and being in the countryside, or even in our gardens, helps to make us thankful to live in a place such as this and reminds us of the benefits and blessings of life itself.

Of course, some people love to walk up the fells and experience that great sense of exhilaration on reaching the summit and surveying the view all around. Sometimes, there isn't a view to survey from the summit and imagination or

past memories have to be exercised, but there is still the benefit of having got to the top. Not everyone sees the benefit of walking up the fells, as someone commented to me recently,

'You only have to walk back down them again afterwards and there is no purpose in that'! Alternatively, we can admire the fells from a distance and enjoy shorter and flatter walks instead.

Wherever we chose to walk, and whether we walk on our own or in the company of others, or indeed with a faithful four-legged companion, doing it regularly brings physical, mental and spiritual benefits.

From a Christian perspective we often talk and think of our faith and life, as walking with Jesus – seeking to follow his example and walking together with other believers, and knowing him walking alongside us.



# **Monthly Letter**

Recently, we experienced a planned power outage. Thankfully, there had already been a notification to warn us. This has not always been the case! Wouldn't it be wonderful if our mental and physical health did the same? Oh, wait. They do!

As we learn to live with covid - I managed to contract it a few weeks ago, after two years - there may be space to reassess and renew things in our lives. We know covid is still around, but there are less severe symptoms for most, and other issues are now pressing. Since we've all been through an extended period of uncertainty and worry, our emotional and physical systems are probably blaring a few warnings for us too - matters to notice and respond too.

There *are* steps we can take in the face of ongoing stress. You can probably guess most of them: regular sleep, switch off times [and devices], prayer or mindfulness, exercise [at least, a walk], one task at a time, remembering you are still here and have managed to be so, do something that is life giving, playing music or hobbies, conversations that lead to laughter. Most especially, seek help if you need to.

There's been talk about a 'reset', post-covid, but there are unexpected issues that have arisen on top of the pandemic - war in Ukraine, the developing energy crisis blighting our cost of living, adding more stress. It's not selfish to look after yourself. You are no good to anyone if you do not. It is not weak to struggle with mental health problems or stress, anymore that it would be to have a toothache.

As it is with our own needs and health - so it is with our wider society. Perhaps there are warnings out there in our society? Global warming springs to mind. I believe that our native birds are nesting sooner with the change in climate. There are many issues that we can only do a limited amount to effect, but something is possible.

More personally, maybe it's time to deal with the blinking light or strange noise in the car, or a pain which won't go away? To let go of unrealistic expectations and stick to your boundaries, and to say 'no' as well as 'yes.' To forgive and set yourself free! [We do not excuse or enable harm, but keep choosing to forgive]. To take the hard decision, because we know it is correct. How can we take out the proverbial log from our neighbours eye, when there is a splinter in ours? A small step in the right direction can lead us on to better things - like a diagnosis just in time, the job offer from doing a task well, or that decision to stop something that needs to end.

One writer likens our souls to a kind of love tank - we need it to be filled up in order to pour out - but mere stuff, pleasures, even some relationships, will not fill it. In a way, God gives each one of us a loyalty card of grace - that when we do the right things, we store up the resources for when it gets hard, and we are also able to enjoy things when life is good. Not just a free coffee after 10 orders! Paraphrasing Jesus, 'he came to give us life, and life more abundantly - but the enemies of our souls only kill, steal, and destroy.' John 10:10.

If your heart has become hard, frozen, or burns with anger - watch out! These things emotional blockages - possibly leading to a heart attack or emotional paralysis - stuck in place. It's clear from research that keeping a watch on our emotions and relationships with others has huge benefits for our well-being. We may not be able to control what happens to us, but we can choose how we respond - bitter or better?

I am now waiting patiently, as I write this, for the power to come back on! I hope you will do something useful in the time and space you have, so that you will have an abundant life, worth living to the full.

# **IREBY and AROUND 4 UKRAINE**

#### **APRIL 2022**

Following on from several posts on the "Ireby, Uldale and Around" Facebook page regarding helping Ukrainian refugees, a group of interested people met on Saturday 2nd April in Ireby to discuss what we could usefully offer from our small corner of Cumbria.

One person at the meeting was waiting to receive 2 families; a mother with 4 children and another mother with 2 children. The process is slow and frustrating but by the time you read this, they may well have arrived at their sponsor's home on the outskirts of Boltongate.

More people are willing to sponsor and some have registered on the government website so arein the system. Those at the meeting decided to work together to make a community response.

It was agreed that we would use our time and collective resources to support any refugee families that are hosted in our area. This will include support for the people or families that are acting as hosts.

Our big-hearted local community has really got behind this and are planning some fund-raising as well as discussing various ways of offering practical and emotional support.

We are keen that our guests have the opportunity to meet up with each other to create their own support networks. We acknowledge that this could be a very isolating experience for them without the opportunity to gather with those who have gone through the same horrific experiences. We also acknowledge that hosts or potential hosts will benefit from talking with others who are taking refugee guests into their homes.

#### **UPDATE JUNE 2022**

One family has indeed arrived and 4 children are settled in local schools. You may have seen the news article of Men in Sheds, from the Northern Fells Group, donating bikes to the children.

Another family is expected mid June. We have had a very successful fund-raising event at a quiz and supper held at Mae's in Uldale.

We have formed a "Small Charity" under Charity Commission guidelines and have a constitution with a chairperson, treasurer and secretary elected as trustees. This has enabled us to open a bank account.

We have created sub-groups so that different people can work on different aspects of support.

We now have a website IASUS.org.uk where you can read more about us and follow our progress in supporting people seeking sanctuary from war in their country.

# Binsey History by Mick Jane

# Sporting Parson Rev. Harold Ewbank Of Boltongate 1933

He was a sporting hero everywhere he lived. Captain of the Cumberland Rugby and Hockey teams, later playing in Leeds and Sheffield. Wrestled at Grasmere, as his father Rev John Ewbank had done. Before him. He gained his swimming blue at Oxford, played cricket for the Yorkshire clergy, and was divisional boxing champion in the Army, where he was above average at billiards and motorcycling. A true aristocrat of sport in both deed and outlook to express himself and think of the good of others. The boys gathered into the light of this philosophy, it was by example, more than constant preaching, that Mr. Ewbank held his boys.

### **Purple Socks**

The text hammered home, was the spirit of comradeship, and the lessons of true sport. That there was something wider in life than prizes and always winning, and that the perfume of a good deed could never tarnish in the memory, like a neglected tin pot on a sideboard. I don't think that Mr. Ewbank really cared a bit about his athletic honours, except for their assistance in his work. He once confessed, with a twinkle in his eye, that a pair of purple socks gave him a lesson of the folly of vanity.

He was "teased" very much about the colour he always affected in socks. So, when he saw a tulip the same hue, labelled "Rev. Ewbank," he thought it was a leg-pull. The Royal Horticultural Society, however, told him the tulip was named after a parson, a well-known grower in the Isle of Wight. He would not forget to tell the story when he next got there. When he left for The Isle of Wight, a long way from his family home of Boltongate, he would be very much missed by the boys of Sheffield, where he had trained and taught them in recent years.



During WW1, he had a visit from his younger brother 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieut. Leonard Ewbank. This turned out to be Leonard's last visit home to visit his family before he was killed by a bullet through the head during WW1. Harold who was known for his ability to do tricks with cards to baffle the young boys and had shown Leonard how to do them whilst he was on leave. Later he wrote home to say how he was now baffling the men in the trenches himself.

The Rev. Ewbank was known in Sheffield as a giant of a fellow, with a big outlook and so very human and understanding with the young children in their early teens. Like a huge St. Bernard dog trained to go modestly about doing good deeds in dreary places. His clerical dog collar was not there to chain him to convention.

Just to remind everyone that the **Binsey Team Lending Library** has now re-opened.



As part of our application, we were asked to fulfil criteria in the areas linked to the five School Games outcomes and we are pleased that the hard work of everyone at our school has been rewarded this year. We have had great support from people in the parish for our fundraising activities, especially in the areas around Blindcrake and Sunderland, and Isel where I live. Now we are in a position to seek more applications for small grants and would welcome ideas from people in Cumbria who have some connection with a project, charity or community in another part of the world.

COAT gives small grants to organisations and communities to support people in some of the poorest parts of the world. We like there to be a Cumbrian connection if possible and we would like to encourage more people and projects based in Cumbria to apply to COAT. It might be a school you have been connected with; it might be that you are a Trustee of a small charity with projects in poorer countries; or someone in your family might have done a volunteer placement abroad. There are so many ways in which people in Cumbria are helping those who are less lucky than we are, and COAT can support that.

In 2021 we gave 12 grants of between £300-£1000 to projects in Cambodia, Zambia, Tanzania, Mozambique among others. All but one had a Cumbrian connection. The grants paid for specific things such things as mobile phones for trainers; educational materials; water pump equipment; and setting up a pig project. My personal favourite was paying to transport no longer needed prosthetic limbs from Cumbria to be reconstructed for amputees in The Gambia. You can see more on our website.
