HARVEST THANKSGIVING

For many years in Britain, we have enjoyed the benefits of cheap food and also an ever-expanding selection of choice with food production increasingly dominated and controlled by the major supermarket chains. However, we know that for a variety of reasons, this perfect combination for the consumer is already coming to an end, as the choice diminishes and most significantly prices increase.

Currently, the war in Ukraine is having a major impact because of the amount of food that was grown there and then exported to millions of people across the world. Obviously, much of these crops have either been destroyed or cannot be harvested and exported. In addition, both Ukraine and Russia were major producers of fertilizer for the global market and as that supply has diminished, so prices have rocketed, which will cause reductions in yields, resulting in further food shortages and causing more price increases. It is the perfect storm when allied to the global impact of climate change and increasing population.



Farming remains an essential industry here in the Binsey Team, and in these last couple of years, we have been even more grateful for our farms, farm shops, and local suppliers.

We are preparing to celebrate Harvest Thanksgiving in most of our churches and Harvest is an opportunity to count our blessings and be thankful for all that is good on 'the bit of earth' entrusted to our care.

And like the people who live on it, the earth itself also needs to be respected and cherished as we are understanding and appreciating even more in these current times.

There is something basic about the earth, about having our feet on the ground, and about having to get our hands dirty. This points to the reality of life, and our need to get alongside each other and work together.

Over these next few months there will be an increasing demand for the Food Banks, and so despite the financial pressures that the vast of majority will face, there is a need for all of us to consider how we can be more be generous and help those who are in greater need.

Harvest Thanksgiving reminds us that we are all creatures of the earth, and dependent on the earth; entrusted with huge powers to make it beautiful or lay it waste; to take it for granted or to be thankful; to be selfish with it, or to be generous.

In these much harder economic times, the call to be generous will challenge many of us, but generosity takes us to the heart of the Christian faith and the love of Jesus Christ freely offered to everyone.

But we felt that we knew her. And we still feel that now.

In fact, we felt that we loved her and we still feel that too now."

"And we feel confident that the Queen loved us, and indeed all the people of this country and the Commonwealth" "The Queen was always mindful of the teaching of Jesus, as recorded in the New Testament.

As a regular attendee at church services, she faithfully honoured the commandment to love God.

And she also equally faithfully honoured the commandment to love our neighbours as ourselves.

In her 1997 Christmas broadcast she said:

in the 1990s."

"What happens to all our love for the Queen, now Grandad?"

God gives us love. Something to love He lends us: but when love is grown To ripeness, that on which it throve Falls off and love is left alone.

Children's Book Review


The House With Chicken Legs by Sophie Anderson

This is a brilliant adventure of a story. Marinka, the main protagonist, enjoys a party every single night in her house, with lively music, food, and dancing. The only problem? All the guests at the party are dead and every night her house grows legs and runs away to a new place!

Based loosely on a Slavic myth, this story is both magic and macabre. You won't be able to put this book down.

Marinka lives with her grandmother who is a Yaga. A Yaga's job is to guide the dead through 'the gate' so they can find their way back to the stars they came from. Unfortunately, Marinka longs for a more normal life with friends of her own (living rather than dead), but she must follow in her grandmother's footsteps and become a Yaga herself.

This beautifully written tale tackles many issues that face young people today: friendship, family, bereavement and taking charge of your own future. Adults and children alike will love this great story. I couldn't let it go for a long time after reading it. The lasting impression it had on me was profound, mostly because of the unexpected and shocking events at the end of the novel.

Rob Barratt




