#### THE IMPORTANCE OF PARENTING

This summer we went on holiday with our son, daughter-inlaw and grandson, who is 18 months old. It has been a real joy and delight to be on holiday together and to spend significant time with our grandson.

Regardless of the importance of our working lives and whatever roles and responsibilities we have, for those of us who have the privilege of a being a parent and then a grandparent, the care and nurture of children is arguably the most important role we can have in life.

Thankfully, despite the inevitable mistakes that all parents make, our 2 children have grown up into well-rounded adults with fulfilling lives and relationships, and the bonds of love



remain strong between us all. Now we have the privilege of being grandparents and the process of care and nurture has begun all over again, although one of the advantages of being a grandparent is that the care and responsibility is only part-time rather than full-time. Our grandson has reached the stage where he understands most of what you say to him and is good at following instructions, but has to be watched all the time, so that he is kept out of harm.

It has been lovely to interact and to play with him, and to see him learning new things and speaking more new words. One of the essential parts of parenting alongside the love, care and nurture is setting appropriate boundaries and establishing good routines of playing, eating and sleeping, so that a child can grow and flourish as God intends.

All children should be brought up understanding how to behave properly and the difference between right and wrong. Currently our grandson has a great interest in watching the dustbin men emptying the dustbins and on holiday always spotted the litter bins. Where we were staying in France there were usually bins close by and whenever we had empty food wrappers, he was very quick to point to the nearest bin, already knowing that rubbish should not be left or thrown on the ground.

Whatever age we are and whatever stage of life we have reached, then God seeks to love and care for each of us as his children, and guide us in the best way through life in our relationships with one another and with him. In his son, Jesus Christ, God gives us the perfect example as to how we should lead our lives and how we should behave towards others, so that together we can lead flourishing and fulfilling lives.

Above all, Jesus has demonstrated his supreme and unparalleled love for the whole of humanity by laying down his life. In his life and in his death showing the true nature of God's unconditional and sacrificial love that all parents and grandparents should seek to model in the love and care of their children.



Nancy's Orange is inspired by Grace Kirby's experiences in a part-time job delivering NHS prescriptions to patients, often elderly and isolated, in the beautiful but remote countryside of the North Pennines and along the Cumbrian stretch of Hadrian's Wall. Brief encounters happen on doorsteps, in gardens, in kitchens and even on balconies, revealing lives richly lived through stories of love and loss, sadness and joy, infused with poetry and humour. The Butterfly Collector As well as a successful actor

and writer, Peter Macqueen is a keen amateur naturalist with a particular passion for butterflies and moths. The Butterfly Collector brings both these strands of his life together by exploring very personal experiences of the effects of climate change. He draws on childhood memories of happy holidays collecting butterflies (he uses a camera now!) and sets them against the drastic attempt to rescue that collection (and those memories) fifty years later, when Storm Desmond flooded more than 7,000 homes in Cumbria, including his own. ### **General News**

#### **Caldbeck Surgery**

Protected Learning Time, the surgery will close at 1 pm and remain closed until the following morning on Wednesday 17th September and Thursday 18th October.

Also we will hold Flu clinics on Saturday 4th October and Saturday 15th November here at the surgery. If patients are eligible and we have COVID vaccine available they will be offered it at the flu appointment .Our patients will be contacted by post or text.

#### **CALDBECK SURGERY CHARITABLE FUND**

Most residents in the area will know of, or be patients of, the Surgery at Caldbeck and the splendid service they provide to our local Community. However, they may not be aware of the Caldbeck Surgery Charitable Fund (CSCF); a registered Charity (No.101039) which was established by Trust Deed in 1992.

The Fund's objectives as laid out in the original Trust Deed are "to assist in the relief of suffering and to preserve and safeguard the health of patients of the Caldbeck Surgery by funding the purchase of medical equipment and services not normally provided by the NHS".

Over the past 20 years CSCF has provided over £100,000 from Donations and Bequests (including gift aid) and has funded over £95,000 of various items of equipment and services enabling the Surgery and the Practice Nurses to diagnose, monitor and treat patients both in the Surgery and at home, thereby avoiding the need for hospital visits for diagnosis and treatment.

CSCF also supports the Northern Fells Group Mini Bus (approximately half of the mini bus journeys are medically related)

The CSCF has also contributed towards the provision of defibrillators in several villages and supported the Village First Responder Teams.

Under the terms of the original Trust Deed, the Fund is vested in, and controlled by, 8 Trustees, all of whom are local residents and patients of Caldbeck Surgery. Totally independent of the Surgery, the Trustees work closely with the Practice Doctors and Staff.

The Fund is financed solely from donations and bequests, many of which are gift aided, enabling the Fund to reclaim 25% from HMRC


