Restart

I wonder if you're the sort of person who likes to set a New Year's resolution each year? It's a mixed bag for me: sometimes I do, sometimes I don't. But according to YouGov research, about 20% of us set a resolution this year, and that number has been on the rise in recent years, and amongst younger people in particular. It would appear that there is something in us that likes a chance to start again afresh, to try something new, and to grow and improve in our lifestyle, health or character.



But it's not quite that straightforward, is it? Good intentions are one thing, but the same research says that of those people who made resolutions, only 28% managed to keep them. That means that as we go about our day-to-day lives, just 1 in 20 of the people we come into contact with are managing to make the changes, achieve the goals and become the sorts of people they've set out to be. To be honest with you, I'm surprised the number is as high as that.

The New Year is full of this energy to change, but one of the things I love about September is that it seems to be another time of year when we have another

chance to start again. For many of us, this is another beginning – another opportunity to start afresh, set new goals, and work towards building the life and becoming the sorts of people we want to be. Yes, it's a time of year that is filled with busyness and challenges, but it also carries this invitation: to have another go, try again, and dream that things could be different.

But please: don't worry if you miss it. These opportunities to start again are not just limited to 1st January or 6thSeptember. In fact, this rhythm of starting again, of having yet another second chance is also what I love about Sundays. As the church gathers to worship each week, we take time to remember that while things may not have gone how we wanted over the last 7 days, the next 7 days don't need to be the same. We can leave the past behind, find forgiveness, and receive help to try again, to have a second chance, to build a different life.

The hope of the Christian gospel is that God will always give us another second chance. Things don't need to be the way that they were yesterday; tomorrow can be brighter and better and more beautiful. My prayer for us all, as we begin again this September, is that we would know God's power to restore, renew and refresh us as we turn to him again for a restart.

Binsey Information

'Thanks for the Memories'.

September 1^{st,} 2023 will see me joining John Spedding in the ranks of Emeritus Readers. Hopefully I will be bringing out my cassock from time to time should my services be needed (no pun intended!).

It was in the Autumn of 1994, whilst Teaching at Boltons school, that Bob Shaw, then Rector of the Benefice of the Boltons, Ireby and Uldale, asked me if I would take the young people's groupwhich John and I ran, to be part of his Family service in Bolton Low Houses Village Hall. We did so the following month and to cut a long story short, I began taking the Family service for him.

So began my involvement with the soon to become five parishes of Torpenhow, All Hallows, Boltons, Ireby and Uldale. Bob retired and Roland Hirst and Jeff Fearnley came as the new clergy. In the summer of 1995, as Roland was ill, I was licensed to Revd. Michael Braithwaite, then Rural Dean. Since then I have witnessed the addition of more and more parishes, until the original 3 have become 11!

So many changes in 29 years, so many struggles and juggling of rotas; Bishops and Clergy came and went, I became the first woman to take services in Setmurthy and Isel and Common worship eventually became the norm. Under Chris Sims we became the Binsey Team, then under Tricia Rogers, a pioneering Ecumenical Mission Community with the Methodist Minister attending our ministry team meetings. There were Diocesan and team missions, even one at Uldalewith help from Embleton and Wythop - another first

So many activities, a Toddler service at Ireby, Prayer Breakfasts at a different church each month, Agape suppers on Maundy Thursday; a post confirmation group at Ireby Vicarage run by Lucy and Ramsey Lunn. Fellowship, Lent and Advent groups, Pentecost Plod, Stepping Stones in the Globe Hall Messy Church at Isel, Teaching days with Bishop James, Travelling Light, Keswick Convention speakers at Bassenthwaite and Uldale and the afternoon Convention speaker by Bassenthwaite Lake -St Bega's ready in case of rain – a very rare occurrence. Soup Lunches at Bassenthwaite and Torpenhow, Healing services; prayer groups, pet services, 'Gad About' suppers at Boltons, Flower Festivals, Palm Sunday Walks of witness at All Hallows and Uldale, the latter with Margaret Redmond's donkey, Christingles, monthly team services in village halls followed by lunch, school assemblies and end of term services, a baptism and millennium bonfire on top of Binseyi. People we loved and see no more, baptisms and joyful wedding celebrations, new hymns that are now old hymn. On and on now the memory cogs are in gear, but I will spare you!

The purpose of this rather indulgent trip down Memory Lane is to thank each congregation who has welcomed me into their midst, encouraged, helped and enriched me by their friendship. Thank you! Also I give thanks for all the past clergy from Bob Shaw to Peter Gilroy, and my fellow Readers all who shared and affirmed my ministry and gave me their friendship too. None of you will be forgotten.

I hope I will be around for a few years yet and will still see you. But this seemed a good time to let you know how much I have valued and esteemed each one of you. Finally may I encourage you to continue to fight the good fight of faith, proclaiming Jesus as Lord and, empowered by the Holy Spirit, set this diocese alight with love for God. Book Review


Still Life by Sarah Winman.

Whilst on holiday at Lake Garda in May, I read this most phenomenal book. I read it because someone recommended it at the Salsa class in Plumbland Village Hall one rainy Wednesday evening. I didn't think much about it really but downloaded it onto my kindle....and wow am I glad I did?! This is an incredible read.

Tuscany, 1944: As Allied troops advance and bombs fall around deserted villages, a young English soldier, Ulysses Temper, finds himself in the wine cellar of a deserted villa. There, he has a chance encounter with Evelyn Skinner, a middle-aged art historian who has come to Italy to salvage paintings from the ruins and recall long-forgotten memories of her own youth. In each other, Ulysses and Evelyn find a kindred spirit amongst the rubble of war-torn Italy, and set off on a course of events that will shape Ulysses' life for the next four decades.

As Ulysses returns home to London, re-immersing himself in his 'crew' at The Stoat and Parrot -- a motley mix of pub crawlers and eccentrics -- he carries his

time in Italy with him. And when an unexpected inheritance brings him back to where it all began, Ulysses knows better than to tempt fate, and returns to the Tuscan hills.



This novel is written in the most beautiful prose, with a touching tenderness, and brilliant comic moments full of light. *Still Life* is a sweeping portrait of unforgettable individuals who come together to make a family, and a richly drawn celebration of everything that is beautiful in life, and love in all its forms. This is a story which explores the cement strong bonds that can form when people choose a family rather than stay with the family they were born to. It's an incredible moving tale of how loyalty, friendship and love can span the ages, as well as the continents. It reminds us that some people in our lives are always there no matter what and that every kite needs an anchor. Now I've read it....I absolutely have to go to Florence.

Thanks Alison, this book changed my life in no small way.

And the parrot? Well, we definitely need to discuss that one!

Today new "aps" can be helpful in locating those in trouble. On the wayout we saw the vehicles which are always packed and ready to go.

Bassenthwaite

At our July meeting we were privileged to be the first group to enjoy Ros Downing's new talk 'A Pictorial Journey through Cumbrian History'. Recognising that to attempt an overview of the history of Cumbria in 45 minutes would be impossible, Ros has called her talk a 'journey', the choice of route being her own' and a 'pictorial journey' as all the bits of history included are illustrated by something we can still see in the landscape today.

Although the county of Cumbria was created relatively recently (1974) from Cumberland, Westmorland, Lancashire North of the Sands and a little bit of Yorkshire the name is much older.

The name Cumbria means 'land of the Cymry' the tribes who were living in this area when the Anglo-Saxons arrived in the 5th Century. Cymry has its origins in the Celtic language word kombrogi meaning fellow countryman.

Ros started her journey with the stone circles of pre-history, one of which we are all familiar – Castlerigg.

Another important feature of pre-history was the early industry of axe making from the green volcanic tuff found on Pike O'Stickle that were not only for local use but have been found widely over the United kingdom from Norfolk to Northern Ireland.

Over the years Britain has been subject to invaders, some have stayed for a while and then left, others have stayed and all have contributed to shaping our country and Cumbria to what it is today.

From AD 43 the Romans occupied Britain for 400 years before withdrawing as their Empire began to fall apart. In Cumbria evidence of their presence is very visible; Hadrian's wall and the Bath house at Ravenglass being but two examples. The Angles, a Germanic people, came as pagans but within two generations had converted to Christianity and the best evidence of their presence is ecclesiastical. The Norse men, often called Vikings, came raiding, found a place they liked and settled in Cumbria. Again evidence of their presence can be found in ecclesiastical settings. The final invasion came from the Normans, and many of their castles and priories, in various states of repair, can be found in Cumbria today. Living in a rural community it would be easy to forget the part that industry has played in Cumbrian history. The textile industries of wool, linen and cotton have all been represented. Mining for coal and iron and the development of the steel industry at Workington. Other minerals mined were copper, lead and graphite, graphite being used in the Pencil factory which until recently was part of Keswick. A rich heritage indeed and thanks to Ros for a most interesting talk and showing us what a great county Cumbria is.

The competition for an artifact related to Cumbrian history stimulated much interest and discussion. The winner was Ros Roberts with a copper card tray from Keswick industrial school of arts and crafts and made over 150 years ago. The entertainment was a word search and the winner Jean Hotton.
