Dear friends,

Have you bought your 'Poppy' yet?

It is that time of year when the volunteers are out on the streets shaking their tins, seeking donations for the 'Earl Haigh' fund or Poppy appeal. This has been a National occurrence for over a hundred years, all the monies collected goes towards the welfare and well-being of all those who gave their lives, or were seriously injured in time of war, (started before we had the N.H.S.) and continues to provide that help and support to those so affected in more recent conflicts.

Memorials, both National and local are dotted around our country, our Churches either have a plaque in, or an obelisk outside around which we gather each year when we Remember as a community those we have lost, a loved one, a relative, friend, family member, neighbour, a loss which may still cause us grief and pain. All of us, during our lives, suffer losses, a parent, child, sibling, relative or friend. Those losses we remember at different times of the year, an anniversary, a birthday, a celebration of a 'family' event. We mourn that loss either individually or as a family, and it is right that we do so, there is no shame in remembering.

Some people, in the minority, suggest that there is enough suffering in the World without reminding ourselves, each year with a public display/ show of grief.

As Christians we know of the sacrifice our Lord and Saviour made for us on the Cross, and remember he told us that we should love each other as he loves us.

We also acknowledge that there will be wars and rumours of war. That does not mean that we should embrace war or conflict, but that we should remember sacrifices made, and are still being made, in the cause of peace.


Care for each other in God's love and kindness.

We have very beautiful churches in our Team, appreciated by so many visitors. Perhaps you may be interested to know who came to one of them during 2021?

What a strange year 2021 was! But people still came to the ancient lakeside church of St Bega.



'How wonderful to find this place of peace and tranquillity still open and welcoming all passers by in this horrid "plague year"' this was from visitors from Bury St Edmunds who were not the only ones who were glad to find the church open in troubled times.

'Delighted you are open'

'Thank you for being open'

'thank you Parish members for ensuring we have this place to pray' Thanks are a regular theme among the comments left.

In spite of all the challenges of 2021 at least 1300 people visited this little, out of the way church. They came from far and wide in the UK, for example: Chester, Cullercoats, Cornwall, Paignton, Putney, Pembroke, Wigan, Whitburn and Winchester. It is not surprising that there were not many from overseas in 2021 but there were entries in the visitors' book from Argentina, Australia, Dubai, New Zealand, Saigon, Sri Lanka and several from the USA.

Visitors arrive here in various ways: a number have walked from St Bees along St Bega's Way, a couple rowed across the lake and one 'Got lost and stumbled upon this beautiful church.' Wendy from Staffordshire made it here at last: 'I have wanted to visit for so long. It doesn't disappoint.'

As usual people come for family reasons, to recall marriages, and to find ancestors' graves. They also mention prayers made and prayers answered.

A large number of people say they are regular visitors; perhaps few have been as many times as Theresa from Sussex who wrote 'I've been coming to this beautiful Thin Place for 37 years now.' She echoes the Celtic value for places where the veil between the solid and the spiritual seems very thin. Others describe a similar experience.

'A real sense of God's presence in this beautiful place'
'Made my day and year to find such a wonderful place that
touched my heart.' 'Just a lovely place to be.' 'Our most
favourite place in the world.'

## **Book Review**

#### Mrs England by Stacey Hall

This is a story that bubbles with mystery, deception and intrigue. Slowly revealing its secrets against the backdrop of a wealthy household in the atmospheric landscape of West Yorkshire at the turn of the century (1904), this tale explores the challenges and power balance of a marriage that on the surface appears at best unusual, and at worst controlling and destructive. The narrator is Ruby a young governess who keenly observes the dynamics of her employers' marriage whilst managing her own deeply hidden traumatic past.

Winner of the Women's prize for Fiction as well as being a Sunday Times Best Seller, this novel has proved itself incredibly popular with readers since its publication last year. When newly graduated nurse Ruby May takes a position looking after the children of Charles and Lilian England, a wealthy couple from a powerful dynasty of mill owners, she hopes it will be the fresh start she needs. But as she adapts to life at the isolated Hardcastle House, it becomes



clear there's something not quite right about the beautiful, mysterious Mrs England. Ostracised by the servants and feeling increasingly uneasy, Ruby is forced to confront her own demons in order to prevent history from repeating itself. After all, there's no such thing as the perfect family - and she should know.

I thoroughly enjoyed every minute of this slightly eerie, slightly gothic and slightly unsettling story — I never read anything that gives me nightmares! The dark atmosphere created so skilfully by Stacey Halls gave me a real urge to delve deeper into this unusual tale. The theme of power and control within relationships as well as the roles of men and women during the early 1900s is one that is still so relevant today. This novel has much to say about the façade that can be presented around relationships and how what appears on the surface can be far from the reality behind closed doors.

A dark and stormy tale, with dark and stormy weather, that perfectly fits this dark and stormy time of year. Light the fire, put the kettle on and grab a copy.

You won't regret it.

## **Parish Council continued**

Blindcrake Parish Council News

The Parish Council met on the 20th September and discussed the traffic in Redmain, Daisy Cottage planning application and Clerk training. The full meeting minutes can be found on the Parish Council website.

**Traffic in Redmain**: Two issues raised by parishioners were brought to the Councils attention. It was noted that at the start and end of the standard working day traffic appeared to be speeding through the village which is within a 30mph zone. To determine the extent of any speeding Highways have been approached about conducting a traffic survey so you may see survey strips across the road. Additionally, mirrors on the 30mph sign near Redmain Hall had been erected. Highways were approached about the placement of these and there potential impact on road users. **Daisy Cottage planning application.** The applicant explained that the purpose of the application was to provide living accommodation for his daughter above the existing garage. Following discussions about the size of the extended garage, the style of the proposed windows and the potential to split the property the Council agreed to submit these concerns along with a decision of No Objection to the application.

Clerk Training. The Council noted that undergoing CiLCA (Certificate in Local Council Administration) training was part of the Clerk's contract. Caldbeck Parish Council, who the clerk now also works for, agreed to split the training costs 50/50 as they would also benefit.

This term has seen our second Zoom meeting with our partner school in India and our KS2 children have enjoyed chatting to the children and teachers there to compare and contrast our daily lives. This term we talked about our journeys to school and in our next meeting we will be comparing parties and festivals and sharing some recipes for party food!

Our Eco-Team have been busy too, introducing some of their plans for improving both our local area and helping to address climate change. They meet regularly and have already got lots of ideas for helping to halt the changes to our planet's climate.


