Thoughts for Lent

Ash Wednesday through to Maundy Thursday is a time of reflection and traditionally a time when people give something up, sometimes a season of fasting, a period of dust and ashes, sackcloth and mourning, and penance – nowadays all rather unfashionable practices. It is in Lent, which we have now entered, when we live again the wilderness period, the period of trial and temptation period, and we look from a position of weakness to God's triumph over death – the promised land of Easter. Because we are now in Lent, I am going to invite you to not so much give some things up but rather to spend more time in prayer during this season.

As Christians, I am convinced that there is no faster, more direct route to intimacy with God than through prayer. We will benefit in this season of Lent if from time to time to we go into our room, shut the door as Jesus taught, and pray in secret to give God as much time as he wants. It is easy in the busyness and pressure of our lives to merely give God some brief windows in our busy schedules and then to very quickly to go on to the next thing. That is of course how we mostly live. But it would be good during this Lent to allow God, who longs to communicate his love for us, to be able to simply do that in the secret place of prayer.

It is worth having open-ended prayer time with God. Open-ended prayer allows God to speak to us and to surprise us. During these times we might linger over past years of our life in order to thank God or to repent. We might want to read the Bible or a liturgy slowly, with time to meditate. We might write whilst praying, perhaps using a journal. Or possibly bring a complicated situation in our lives to be considered before God – what would Jesus do in this situation? There can be conversations with Jesus, silence, or shouting, (see Psalm 150) or singing. It doesn't matter if our attention wanders or if we drop off to sleep – there is time to wake up and pick up where we left or find a new thread.

So let's make time for prayer this Lent and as we do so, we might well find we develop a taste for these extended times of prayer. Lenten resolutions can be an excellent way of leading us along that road of reformed habits and disciplines. Resolutions, and perhaps the discipline to spend more times in prayer, are best written down. And regularly, through Lent, or beyond, we should check up on ourselves and take stock. There are always things we should do, that we know we should do, that we always mean to do, but that we go on postponing unless we pin ourselves down to a precise discipline, like prayer

Please note that several of our churches are small, so not able to accommodate more than 50-60 guests, and St James, Uldale is not currently available because of major restoration work


Book Review

Framed By Frank Cottrell-Boyce

Strictly speaking this book was written for children, but I defy anyone to read it and not laugh outloud. Like all of Frank Cottrell Boyce's novels they are written for a child audience but with a very 'grown-up' sense of humour.

Dylan is the only boy living in the tiny Welsh town of Manod. His parents run the Snowdonia Oasis Auto Marvel garage - and when he's not trying to persuade his sisters to play football, Dylan is in charge of the petrol log. And that means he gets to keep track of everyone coming in and out of Manod - what car they drive, what they're called, even their favourite flavour of crisps. But when a mysterious convoy of lorries trundles up the misty mountainside towards an old, disused mine, even Dylan is confounded. Who are these people - and what have they got to hide?

A story inspired by a press cutting describing how, during World War II, the treasured contents of London's National Gallery were stored in Welsh slate mines. Once a month, a morale-boosting masterpiece would be unveiled in the village and then returned to London for viewing. This is a funny and touching exploration of how art - its beauty and its value - touches the life of one little boy and his big family in a very small town.



I loved this book as I love all his novels. I literally had tears of laughter streaming down my face. A brilliant story told in his easily accessible writing style. A light -hearted and rewarding read for anyone aged 9-90! If not this one, choose any of his other novels for an equally laugh out loud experience.

20 Mar.1653 Oliver Cromwell, Lord Protector of England, dissolves the Long Parliament.

21 Mar.1556 England's first Protestant Archbishop of Canterbury, Thomas Cranmer is burnt at the stake as a heretic, under the Catholic Queen Mary I, also know as "Bloody Mary".

22 Mar.1824 The British Parliament voted to purchase 38 paintings at a cost of £57,000, to establish a national collection which is now housed in the National Gallery, Trafalgar Square, London.

23 Mar.1956 Queen Elizabeth II laid the foundation stone of a new cathedral being built in Coventry. The new building is being erected next to the remains of the 14thcentury cathedral destroyed by the German Luftwaffe in 1940.24 Mar.1603The crowns of England and Scotland were united when King James VI of Scotland succeeded to the English throne.



School News

Plumbland

As we are an accredited 'forest school' our children regularly take part in a forest school learning programme at woodland at Torpenhow and our infants have thoroughly enjoyed their block of forest learning. They have worked as a team to create a joint shelter, played team games, made rope supports to help them navigate the stream walk and observed how the forest has changed since their visit in the Summer term. The hot drinks around the fire circle have also been very popular, especially in the colder temperatures.

We were so impressed with the determination that our children in years 3,4,5,and 6 displayed during their cross country competition at Silloth on what was a very windy day. We were really proud of all of you. Our sports programme has also been enhanced by expert multi skills tuition led by Rob Jefferson for Infants and Juniors and kinder cricket for our younger children led by Chris Hodgson.

Children in Years 3,4,5, and 6 had the opportunity to work with a real artist- Alex Jacob Whitworth and created some rather brilliant dry point prints which we are currently displaying in our school hall.

Our new classroom is almost completed and we are very excited about using this and the huge difference it will make to our ever- growing school. Thank you so much to the team at Roland Hills for all their hard work and for the high quality finish. We all feel the new edition is completely in character with the rest of our historical building and has created a much needed space.

The Christian value we have been focusing on for this term is Wisdom and we are looking forward to joining in with the Worship time our year 5 children will be leading on this. We have considered Wisdom in relation to the choices we make in life and listened to examples of bible stories and verses on this theme. We are also busy planning our Easter service at St Cuthbert's Church, Plumbland and will be welcoming our families to this later in the term.

Ireby

As we approach half-term in the middle of the Spring Term, it seems like a good opportunity to share some of the learning that the pupils at Ireby have been involved in and to provide you with a little snapshot of what happens in our classrooms. For example, in history, our Year 5 and 6 pupils (Upper Key Stage 2) have been learning about the changing lives of people using Census records. The children asked the question "What happened to Mary Bucktrout?" and were able to follow her life through the 1841, 1851 and 1861 census. Their discoveries inspired interesting observations and questions including a study of child labour in Victorian cotton mills. This class will be visiting Carlisle Archive Centre soon to continue their investigations and studies into the lives of people living in our local area. The lower Key Stage 2 pupils, Year 3 and 4, travelled to Amazonia in Scotland and had a wonderful day immersing themselves in their geography topic Rainforests where they could see for themselves how different species live and have adapted in a tropical environment. The pupils are currently very busy practising their performance for the U-Dance Festival at the Sands Centre in Carlisle in March. They have jointly written and choreographed a dance with Ms Hartwell which depicts the very powerful story of the issues of deforestation in the Amazon rainforest. The Early Years and Key Stage 1 children went off to The Solway Aviation Museum near Carlisle to explore first hand how aeroplanes have been built and developed over the years as they have been learning about Transport and the history of flight.

Our Key Stage 2 scientists have been getting well and truly involved in hands-on experiments in the classroom. While learning about friction they have been exploring many questions including, "Does mass affect fiction?", "Do different surfaces have an impact on friction?", and "How is the movement of different shaped boats affected by water resistance?" By learning to think and behave like scientists they have discovered that, by increasing the mass by 10g each time and measuring the results with a Newton Meter, mass does have an effect on friction. The pupils have been talking about how, in science, accuracy and precision is vital, and it is always important to make their tests fair. They have found how important teamwork is, and that scientists work in a calm, thoughtful and curious manner.

Thank you very much to Jen Logan who recently came into school to lead some emergency First Aid training for the Key Stage 2 class, involving the children in learning about and having a go at some life saving techniques.



Bassenthwaite

The work of the small local charity DeWoDe, (Dedicated Women in Development), was featured at our January meeting when our speakers were Pauline and Douglas Hardie.

DeWoDe, set up by Pauline and Douglas over 25 years ago, supports a group of women in the Kabermaido District, Northern Uganda. This is an area affected by poverty and which suffered in the conflicts with the Lords Resistance Army. The women were determined to improve their situation and that of their community. Over the years, DeWoDe have supported the women of the village by helping with agricultural projects and building Pakegido Health Centre, in Kolbulubulu village. They have raised funds to build staff accommodation and continue to raise funds for staff wages and the further development of the Health Centre. Fund raising initiatives are advertised in to get to the top of Skiddaw – most coming to help out in the Binsey Link, Embleton section, and DeWoDe has a Facebook page where photos and news are shared from Kobulubulu village and the Health Centre. This is a very worthy cause which depends largely on local support in Cumbria.

The competition for a recycled object was won by Helen Hunt with a fantastic model of a bird created from recycled cutlery.

The quiz on Famous Women was won by Judy and Kate. Our meeting in March is the AGM and catered supper. The competition is 'a kitchen utensil' and the hostesses for the evening are Mesdames G. Mawson, R. Roberts and L. Slater.

She is a regular volunteer at the Lake District charity after becoming involved with its outdoor activities with her family. Her stepson uses a wheelchair and is non verbal but because of the charity has gained so much enjoyment throughout his life. Its outdoor programme has enabled him to drive a horse and cart, sail on small dinghies on Bassenthwaite Lake and experience a catamaran ride from Ambleside. It was heart warming to hear from Alison, whose personal experiences demonstrated how important the charity can be to those it serves. It helps so many overcome access barriers to sport and the outdoors. For her, the team of instructors supported the family ambition their free time to make sure everyone remained as safe as possible. The Calvert Trust has had a tough few years since Covid arrived and is only now seeing booking numbers return to pre pandemic levels. Fundraising and donations are vital in its work to help make The Lakes accessible and to create a positive difference for visitors with disabilities. 


