


# **Book Review**

#### The Snow Child by Eowyn Ivey

Since the clocks turned back, we have been plunged once more into what feels already like the winter months. Where did that summer go? Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness? The autumn seems vanished already. And so here we are..cold air and dark nights. I think we might as well embrace it and this month's novel certainly does that. It is a snow filled fantasy where the gnawing cold is so perfectly described it makes you want to light the fire. This is a winter read for sure.

Alaska, 1920: a brutal place to homestead, and especially tough for recent arrivals Jack and Mabel. Childless, they are drifting apart--he breaking under the weight of the work of the farm; she crumbling from loneliness and despair. In a moment of levity during the season's first snowfall, they build a child out of snow. The next morning the snow child is gone--but they glimpse a young, blonde-haired girl running through the trees. This little girl, who calls herself Faina, seems to be a child of the woods. She hunts with a red fox at her side, skims lightly across the snow, and somehow survives alone in the Alaskan wilderness. As Jack and Mabel struggle to understand this child who could have stepped from the pages of a fairy tale, they come to love her as their own daughter. But in this beautiful, violent place, things are rarely as they appear, and what they eventually learn about Faina will transform all of them.



Although I'll admit that fantasy novels are not my thing at all and that magic creatures are not my go to, this novel utterly enchanted me. I was a little sceptical at first but once I'd read a couple of chapters I was hooked. The language is lyrical and beautiful. The landscape is vivid and brutal. And the characters are brilliantly drawn with all their human flaws and failings. The emotions that run through this novel are as sharp the coldness of the snow. The brilliance of the exploration of the human condition here is phenomenal and I found it both relatable and educational about the plight of others. Through the journey of this story the characters are transformed in every way by their developing relationships and I found this a beautiful, hope filled read exploring the power of connecting with others

So I say..let it snow, let it snow, let it snow. Embrace this chilly read as we head into winter

# **December birthdays**

- 1 Dec. 1910 Dame Alicia Markova, London-born ballet dancer famed for her interpretations of Giselle.
- 2 Dec. 1899 Sir John Barbirolli, after serving in WWI he moved to the USA as conductor of the New York Philharmonic Orchestra
- 3 Dec. 1857 Joseph Conrad, born of Polish parents he became a naturalized British subject in 1884, his early experiences at sea inspired his many novels which include Chance, and perhaps his masterpiece Lord Jim (1900).
- 4 Dec. 1795 Thomas Carlyle, the son of a Dumfries-shire stonemason he was educated at Edinburgh University, a distinguished historian and author of such works as The French Revolution and History of... Fredrick the Great.
- 5 Dec. 1830 Christina Georgina Rossetti, London-born poet whose earliest works appeared before she was in her teens, her better known collections include Goblin Market (1862) and The Prince's Progress (1866).
- 6 Dec. 1421 Henry VI, succeeded his father Henry V as king of England at the age of nine months. As Unlucky Henry was murdered in 1471.
- 7 Dec.1761 Madame Tussaud, started her apprenticeship during the French Revolution making death masks from the heads of guillotined prisoners.
- 8 Dec. 1542 Mary Stuart, Queen of Scots, Scottish queen who was forced to abdicate in favour of her son James VI (James I of England), and was later imprisoned and eventually executed by her cousin, Queen Elizabeth I of England.
- 9 Dec. 1608 John Milton, London-born poet Some of his greatest works were written after he lost his sight in 1652 included Paradise Lost, Paradise Regained and Agonistes.
- 10 Dec. 1960 Kenneth Branagh, Belfast-born Shakespearean actor and director of several films
- 11 Dec. 1929 Sir Kenneth MacMillan, born in Dunfermline, he was one of the original members of the Sadler's Wells Theatre Ballet and went on to choreograph ballets for many of the world's foremost companies.
- 12 Dec. 1879 Percy Eastman Fletcher, Derby-born light music composer whose works include Bal Masque and his composition for the brass band An Epic Symphony.
- 13 Dec. 1903 John Piper, painter and writer, famed for his dramatic pictures of war damage and the stained glass he designed for Coventry Cathedral.
- 14 Dec. 1895 George VI, King of Great Britain, who succeeded to the throne when his brother, Edward VIII abdicated to marry the American divorcee Mrs Wallis Warfield Simpson.
- 15 Dec. 1734 George Romney, Lancashire-born portrait painter, most of the leading aristocrats and cultural figures of the day sat for him including Lady Emma Hamilton.
- 16 Dec. 1485 Catherine of Aragon, first wife of King Henry VIII of England and mother of Mary Tudor. After failing to produce a male heir Henry divorced her without papal approval which led to the English Reformation.
- 17 Dec. 1778 Sir Humphrey Davy, Cornish chemist who invented the safety lamp for miners. Discovered a whole bunch of 'ium's' including sodium, barium, magnesium, potassium and strontium.
- 18 Dec. 1779 Joseph Grimaldi, London-born comic actor, singer and acrobat, the original man behind the now famous white-face clown make-up.
- 19 Dec. 1790 Sir William Edward Parry. In 1827 he travelled further north than anyone had done previously in an unsuccessful attempt to reach the pole.
- 20 Dec. 1926 Geoffrey Howe, served in Margaret Thatcher's Conservative government of the 1970's and 80's. His highly critical resignation speech over her intransigence contributed to her replacement as party leader and PM.
- 21 Dec. 1804 Benjamin Disraeli. He shaped the face of modern Conservatism and political party.
- 22 Dec. 1949 Maurice and Robin Gibb, two thirds of the Bee Gees.
- 23 Dec. 1732 Sir Richard Arkwright, he developed a machine for spinning cotton.
- 24 Dec. 1167 John, King of England, brother of Richard the Lion Heart.
- 25 Dec. 1642 Isaac Newton, the son of a Lincolnshire farmer who went on to become the greatest scientist of his (and some would say any) day.
- 26 Dec. 1792 Charles Babbage, London-born mathematician who designed and built first his 'difference engine', and later his 'analytical engine', the forerunners to the modern digital computer.
- 27 Dec. 1773 Sir George Cayley, aviation pioneer who built his first toy helicopter in 1784. He went on to build the worlds first unmanned glider in 1809, a hot air engine in 1807 and manned gliders between 1849 -53.
- 28 Dec. 1882 Sir Arthur Stanley Eddington, Cumbrian astronomer and author, his works include The Nature of the Physical World and Space, Time and Gravitation.
- 29 Dec. 1809 William Ewart Gladstone, Liberal politician becoming prime minister no less than four times.
- 30 Dec. 1865 Rudyard Kipling, English author and poet, most of whose works are concerned with India where he was born. Among his books for children are the Just So Stories and perhaps his most famous The Jungle Book.
- 31 Dec. 1720 Charles Edward Stuart, Scottish royal known as Bonnie Prince Charlie and the Young Pretender, whose attempt to claim the Scottish and English thrones ended in failure following the Battle of Culloden in 1746.





# WI

#### **Bassenthwaite**

The 5th Earl of Lonsdale', nicknamed 'The Yellow Earl of Lowther' because of his penchant for that colour, was the subject of a very interesting and well researched talk by Mike Cowen at our October meeting. Born in January 1857, Hugh Cecil Lowther was the second son of Henry Lowther, the 3rd Earl of Lonsdale, and was never expected to become Earl himself. His older brother George was well educated in the affairs of the estate but Hugh's education was largely ignored. He was thought irresponsible, living the life of a playboy but with very little money of his own. He married the Lady Grace Gordon in 1878, although her family were opposed to the marriage, and lived at Barleythorpe Hall near Oakham, (part of the Lonsdale estate). Sadly Grace suffered a miscarriage after a fall while hunting after which she was unable to bear children and remained a partial invalid for the rest of her life. In 1882 Hugh's elder brother died and Hugh became the 5th Earl of Lonsdale. Hugh inherited enormous wealth largely derived from his father's Cumberland coalmines and owned 75,000 acres of land. He had residences at Lowther Castle, at Whitehaven Castle, Barleythorpe and Carlton House Terrace, London. A keen huntsman, he was Master of the Quorn and the Cottesmore for long periods. After the First World War he became very involved with racehorses and was a senior steward of the jockey Club. He was also involved in the world of boxing and donated the original Lonsdale belts for the boxing championship trophy. He was founder and first president of the Automobile Association. In 1895 and again in 1902 he entertained the German Emperor Wilhelm at Lowther Castle for grouseshooting. He was very taken with German motorcars and we were shown a photograph of 20 Mercedes cars, all yellow, lined up outside Lowther Castle, all belonging to the Earl. His was a very extravagant lifestyle and from 1921 he was forced to sell some of his inherited properties. In 1935 he moved from Lowther Castle because he could no longer afford to live there and moved to much smaller accommodation. He died in 1944 at Stud House Barleythorpe, aged 87.

His first dog was a Springer who was trained to locate bodies. He mainly uses Springers and Labradors and uses his dogs to detect drugs and explosives. He said that dogs are able to detect many things from cancer to voles and bedbugs, Beagles are also good at this as they are very laid back. When selecting a puppy he looks for keenness at playing and hunting for things. They are accustomed to all the environments that they will be working in, like noises & crowds and slippery floors. We then met Tilly & Billy who are half lab and springer and four months old. Some pups are motivated by food or toys and initially play at finding them. His drug detection dogs work at places like festivals, night clubs and race meetings. When they scent something they indicated by looking at the person or following them. Finally we met Charlie, a mixed breed, who is a trained explosive search dog. They are trained to find about fifteen different ones. He had a good hunt around the village hall and soon found what had been planted and he got rewarded with a tennis ball. Jenny thanked him for his excellent talk.


