#### Rest

As we head into the summer months, I've started to think about rest, holidays, and taking a break. As I think about them, I realise there isn't a quick-fix, 5-step-plan to getting true, proper rest. A good night's sleep is one thing, but what about the deep rest that goes all the way to the core of our souls and resists burnout, enables true life and creates the fertile soil in our lives that we need to flourish and grow? Is that sort of rest possible?

I believe the answer is yes – that this sort of rest isn't just an unattainable pipedream. In fact, in the Bible, it's the sort of life we're told we are created for. But believing that is one thing – experiencing it is another! It will come as no surprise that to achieve this sort of life takes more than just a day off, a walk in the fells, or a nice holiday. It means choosing and receiving a *better* rest.

I've found that to go forwards in experiencing this rest, it can be helpful to look backwards. There's ancient wisdom – some of it discovered and explored by men and women throughout history who knew Cumbria well – that says this sort of rest comes in part from daily, weekly, and yearly choices that help to make us the sorts of people we want to become.

The followers of Jesus, for generations, have chosen daily to carve out time to slow down, to reflect, to be thankful and to be with God in prayer and scripture. They've created daily moments of rest rather than just waiting for the possibility of rest tomorrow.

They've worked hard each week to carve out 'sabbath' rest – sometimes a dedicated 24-hours away from the grind of life, but at other times whatever they could manage to do to step away from their work and remember they are human *beings* before they are human *doings*.

And they've taken time in a yearly rhythm to celebrate, to



remember, to look around at all the things they have and be grateful for with friends and family. We call these 'holidays', but they were originally about 'making the days holy' – setting apart time to be something special, something life giving, and something significant.

As I begin life and work in Cumbria heading into a time that for some will be full of work and for others will hold special moments of rest, my prayer for us all is that we would find time this summer to set apart parts of our days, weeks and months so that we might be restored. It's the gift that God longs to give us.

Hello! My name is John, and I am excited to have joined the Binsey Team and moved up to be a part of the community here. We've moved quite a long way to be here, having come from Reading in Berkshire, which is near where both Steph and I grew up. While we're sure there will be plenty to learn about the particularities of life here, we're loving it so far, and have been so grateful for the warm welcome we've received from many, many friendly faces.

I've worked for churches for several years now, both as a priest and as a musician, around Reading and in London. Before that, I studied Biochemistry at university but decided early on that what I was most passionate about was helping people to experience Jesus for themselves, in their real lives, today. 1 July.1838 British scientist Charles Darwin presented a paper to the Linnean Society in London, on his theory of the evolution of species and natural selection.

2 July.1644 Parliamentarian forces defeated Prince Rupert at the Battle of Marston Moor.

3 July.1996 It was confirmed that the Stone of Scone, the symbol of the Scottish nation taken by Edward I of England in 1296, was to be returned to Scotland from Westminster Abbey where it has been used in the coronation of 30 British monarchs.

4 July.1776 Congress accepted the Declaration of Independence written by Thomas Jefferson, formally ending American links with Britain.

5 July.1791 George Hammond was appointed the first British Ambassador to the USA.

6 July.1535 Former favourite of King Henry VIII Sir Thomas More was executed after refusing to recognise the King as the head of the Church.

7 July.1307 English King Edward I, conqueror of Wales and "Hammer of the Scots" dies on the way to Scotland to fight Robert the Bruce.

8 July.1822 Leading romantic poet Percy Bysshe Shelley drowned in the Bay of Spezia, when his boat sunk in a storm. 9 July.1877 The inaugural Lawn Tennis Championship was played on top of the croquet lawns at Wimbledon, Spencer W Gore taking the men's singles title.

10 July. 138 Death of the Roman Emperor Hadrian who ordered the building of a wall across northern England to keep out the barbarian Scottish tribes.

11 July. 1690 Deposed Roman Catholic King of England James II was defeated by the current king, William III or William of Orange, at the river Boyne, Ireland.

12 July. 1910 British pilot Charles Stewart Rolls, 33, died after his French built biplane crashed at a flying competition in Bournemouth, Dorset. He was a partner in the Rolls-Royce car manufacturing company.

13 July. 1923 The British parliament passes a law banning the sale of alcohol to under-18's.

14 July. 1858 Birthday of Emmeline Pankhurst, English suffragette who suffered imprisonment in order to gain the vote for women.

15 July. 1857 200 British men, women and children are chopped up by local butchers and thrown down a well at Cawnpore, as the Indian Mutiny continues.

16 July. 1557 Death, from natural causes, of Anne of Cleves, fourth wife of Henry VIII.

17 July. 1453 French troops defeat the English at Castillon, effectively ending the Hundred Years' War. Calais remains under English control.

18 July. 1920 750,000 war dead are commemorated with the unveiling of a new national monument in Whitehall, London. The Cenotaph takes its name from the Greek words kenos and taphos meaning empty tomb.

19 July. 1545 King Henry VIII looks on as his newly refitted flagship the Mary Rose sinks in the Solent, off England's south coast, with the loss of 700 lives.

20 July. 1588 The Spanish Armada consisting of 130 warships set sail for England from Corunna.

21 July. 1969 The Eagle lands on the moon and US astronaut Neil Armstrong is the first man in history to walk on its powdery surface. (Editors note—Allegedly!)

22 July. 1946 More than a year after the end of World War Two, bread is rationed in Britain. The shortage is blamed upon a poor harvest and drought.

23 July. 1940 The Local Defence Volunteers changes its name to the Home Guard. The one million-strong force, which includes many World War One veterans, is intended to form Britain's last line of defence against the expected German invasion.

24 July. 1567 Mary Queen of Scots abdicates after defeat by the Protestants at Carberry Hill, near Musselburgh.

25 July. 1814 The chief engineer at the Killingworth colliery, George Stevenson, unveils Blutcher, a steam powered locomotive that can haul eight carriages loaded with 30 tons of coal at the break-neck speed of 4 mph.

26 July. 1978 The worlds first test-tube baby is born in Oldham General Hospital near Manchester. Gynecologist Patrick Steptoe and physiologist Dr Robert Edwards are credited with this pioneering work.

27 July. 1953 The Korean War is formally ended with the signing of a peace agreement at Panmunjom.

28 July. 1540 A busy day for King Henry VIII as he has Thomas Cromwell beheaded and then goes on to marry Catherine Howard.

29 July. 1588 The Spanish Amada is sighted off the coast of Cornwall. The English fleet under the command of Charles Howard and Francis Drake set sail from Plymouth, to establish the birth of British naval supremacy.

30 July. 1966 England win the Jules Rimet trophy, Association Football's World Cup, at Wembley Stadium in London after beating Germany 4-2 in extra time.

31 July. 1667The Second Anglo-Dutch War ends with the peace of Breda.

3 August 1926 Britain's first set of electric traffic lights appear on the streets of London.

5 August 1962 Nelson Mandela imprisoned for attempting to overthrow South Africa's apartheid rule.

6 August 1881 Birth of Sir Alexander Fleming, Scottish discoverer of penicillin.

7 August 1840 Britain bans the employment of climbing boys as chimney sweeps.

8 August 1963 Britain's Great Train Robbery – £2.6 M stolen from Royal Mail.

9 August 1757 Birth of Thomas Telford, Scottish civil engineer credited with opening up northern Scotland by building roads, bridges and waterways.

10 August 1675 King Charles II lays the foundation stone of the Royal Observatory in Greenwich.

11 August 1897 Birth of best-selling children's writer Enid Blyton, whose books have been among the world's bestsellers since the 1930s, with more than 600 million sold.

12 August 1822 Lord Castlereagh, British Foreign Secretary, commits suicide. In his role as Foreign Secretary he managed the coalition that defeated Napoleon.

13 August 1964 Peter Allen and John Walby become the last people to be hanged in Britain.

14 August 1945 Japan surrenders to the Allies, ending the Second World War.

15 August 1888 Birth of Thomas Edward Lawrence 'of Arabia'.

16 August1819 The Peterloo Massacre took place in Manchester at St. Peter's Fields.

17 August 1896 Mrs. Bridget Driscoll of Croydon, Surrey, became the first pedestrian in Britain to die after being hit by a car.

18 August 1587 Birth of Virginia Dare, the first child of English parents to be born in the Roanoke Colony in what is now North Carolina, USA. What became of Virginia and the other early colonists remains a mystery to this day.

19 August 1646 Birth of John Flamsteed, Britain's first Astronomer Royal. He would go on to publish a catalogue that identified 2,935 stars.

20 August 1940 Winston Churchill referring to the RAF pilots, says " Never in the field of human conflict was so much owed by so many to so few".

21 August 1765 King William IV born. William would go on to serve in the Royal Navy, earning him the nickname the "Sailor King".

22 August 1485 Richard III becomes the last English king to die in battle, killed at Bosworth Field in Leicestershire. 23 August 1940 The first night of the Blitz as German planes bomb the city of London.

24 August 1875 Matthew Webb (Captain Webb) started his attempt from Dover in Kent, to become the first person to swim the English Channel. He reached Calais, France at 10.40 am the following morning, having been in the water for 22 hours.

31 August 1900 Coca Cola is sold for the first time in Britain.


### **Book Review**

### Chocolat

You may wonder why this month's review is of a book from so long ago...bear with me and I'll tell you at the end!

Back in 1999, a beautiful novel burst onto the literary scene. It seems such a long time ago, but I remember reading this as if I had just closed the final page yesterday. It won some minor prizes at the time, and yet only a year later was turned into a film. The real testament of it's power and brilliance though stands the fact that it has stood the test of time and even now, readers rave about its incredible prose and its incredible impact. This novel is pure sensuous joy from start to finish.

Chocolat is a timeless novel of a fairly dull, restrictively traditional, straitlaced village's awakening to joy and pleasure. In tiny Lansquenet, where nothing much has changed in a hundred years, mysterious newcomer Vianne Rocher and her exquisite chocolate shop arrive and instantly begin to play havoc with Lenten vows. Each box of luscious bonbons comes with a free gift: Vianne's uncanny perception of its buyer's private discontents and a clever, caring cure for them. Is she



witch? Soon the parish no longer cares, as it abandons itself to temptation, happiness, and a dramatic face-off between Easter solemnity and the pagan

gaiety of a chocolate festival. It's a battle for the hearts and minds of the villagers between the old ways and the new thinking which puts love, kindness and people at its heart instead of rules, judgements and constraints.

Chocolat's every page offers a description of chocolate to melt in the mouths of chocoholics everywhere. The descriptive passages pull the reader magnetically into a world of the warm, comforting aromas of melting chocolate and spices nobody could resist. The tiny hint of magic makes this an truly enchanting and bewitching novel: a real modern classic.

This is a fabulous holiday read especially if you are venturing to a quiet French village...look out for the chocolate shop!




