Children's Treat

We often hear young people saying, "we haven't got anything to do". Do they know that before WW1, most children, regardless if they were tired, would be working after school? Helping on the local farms, or in other occupations such as a paperboy, and from a very early age would have learned how to entertain themselves.

I found this interesting extract from 5th August 1899, which gives us evidence that children often had to rely on local dignitaries to provide treats for them.

Uldale School Treat

"The children's treat this year was an especially pleasant one, as it was kindly given by Miss Gough at Whitefield House, an ideal place for such gatherings. Tea was served in the hall and was not the least enjoyable part of the entertainment, the children having been bountifully catered for. Many friends had been invited to help and did all in their power to make the treat a success. Swings had been put up which were always filled. The children also were greatly pleased with the maze, or "puzzle garden," in which they constantly lost themselves. After tea there were races, games, and dancing on the lawn, and an abundant supply of sweets and nuts. The evening was ended by the distribution of prizes for attendance at school during the past year. These were bought with funds in hand from the children's Christmas entertainment, and were kindly given away by Miss Gough. The Rector, in thanking Miss Gough for her kindness to the children, said, on behalf of the parish, how glad he was to welcome her and Mrs. Lawrence back to Whitefield, where they propose to live after some considerable repairs to the house."

Miss Josephine M. A. Gough was unmarried and lived with her elderly Aunt at Whitefield House. She was born in Madeira, Portugal, where she lived with her parents. Her mother Maria came from Ireby. Prior to Uldale, the family had been landowners in Berkshire. Josephine died in 1912 aged 52. After 1952, Whitefield House was renamed Overwater Hall and is now a large hotel.

Blessing Counting 2020

We hear a lot of bad news, some of it in our own heads! However, there is much evidence to the contrary. For the vast majority, life across the globe is improving, and rapidly. (Cf. *The world is doing much better than the bad news makes us think*, in The Washington Post, by Arthur C. Brooks, 2/12/2019).

For us privileged folk in the West, we can give thanks for so many things we often take for granted. We need to remember that what we have did not happen by chance. Our freedom was fought for and still needs protecting. Also, our wellbeing and happiness is at stake, too. Unfortunately, human greed and dark designs are not relegated to an ancient or medieval past.


We can improve our own lives by focusing on the blessings we have, not what we lack. Nothing in life is perfect, but good things surround us if we look for them and take note. Conventional wisdom says that we should *count our blessings*. This is not a trite and useless saying. It's true. Research shows that being positive is effective and life enhancing, when we frame things from a *blessing* perspective, and we show gratitude. (Cf. *Why 'Thank You' Is More Than Just Good Manners*, by Dean, J. (2018) at Psych Central).

Things are getting better, however, challenges remain. Including, being positive. One suggestion is to occasionally switch off the news as there is a clear tendency to promote the negative and minimize the good. One man has done so, with absolutely no regret. 'In 2013 Rolf Dobelli stood in front of a room full of journalists and proclaimed that he did not read the news... And he practises what he preaches. He hasn't read the news for a decade. His book, 'Stop Reading the News' is Dobelli's manifesto about the dangers of the most toxic form of information - news. He shows the damage it does to our concentration and wellbeing, and how a misplaced sense of duty can misdirect our behaviour.' Described at Amazon.co.uk – other outlets are available!

Lest you wonder whether this is all just a rose-tinted, Pollyanna view of the real world or aimed at minimizing suffering and grief. Not at all. As I look over my life, I've been beaten up outside a pub, faced bullies in school and church, mugged at knifepoint in Amsterdam, been threatened with a knife in church in San Francisco, had a cancer scare in Atlanta, been crashed into by a lad driving his dad's car, lost close family members to sudden and deadly illnesses, including cancer, leukaemia, and blood clots. Several relatives have faced mental illness, and I've been for surgery more than once. However, this is never the whole story, nor does what we read, hear, and gossip about show us a true picture.

It is one thing to be uninformed and unconcerned; it is another to be misinformed. There is a flood of fake and partial news, biased bots, Twitterers, hackers, and activists out there. The media well understand we are programmed to react to the negative: *if it bleeds, it leads*. (Cf. *Negative Information Weighs More Heavily on the Brain*, by Ito, Larsen, et al., Journal of Personality and Social Psychology 75(4):887-900, November 1998). So, we must push back to embrace the truth of the positive. The bible encourages Christians 'to give thanks in all things,' not, for all things! 1 Thess 5:18; Some are most definitely bad. The Apostle Paul, lists terrible persecutions for his faith even to the point of death: 2 Cor 11:22-31. Yet, he sees that the good will outlast and overwhelm the bad in God's time. Rom 8:18-25.

How about staring this year afresh by limiting the bad news we take in? As I learned from computer work, 'GiGo – garbage in, garbage out!' It is the same with our hearts, minds, bodies and planet.

The new discipline of Positive Psychology helps people realise what powers a good life and it suggests we can improve our capacity for happiness. There is even *The Happiness Course*, offered in churches across the country.

A principle of life is that we tend to become what we think about. So perhaps it would be worthwhile to start to journal/list our blessings instead of problems, to actively look for good news instead of taking on board the negatives we are often exposed to. I think you will be glad that you did!

Being a Mission Community



I looked across the field and what did I see? It was black, low -slung and on the hunt. The Beast of Binsey!

Of course, it was just a local cat on the prowl.

it appears to be. There is no predatory big cat terrorising our

green paradise, thankfully. When it concerns the view we have of institution, and especially of the church, we can have a skewed view that is not accurate as well. It is frequently not as bad as some might think, in fact, not bad at all.

Across this area, we are privileged to have wonderful churches, places of peace for quiet and worship, and for time to reconnect with our souls, and with God. During busy lives, sometimes almost relentless pressures from circumstances, how good it is to find some semblance of sanctuary. That is one of the great benefits of having open churches. We have twelve churches, and one chapel spread from Plumbland to Boltongate, Bassenthwaite to Fletchertown, and points in between. They are here for you as well.

In the history book of early Christians, the Acts of the Apostles, we read that the believers met from house to house, but also in the Temple in Jerusalem (Acts 2:46). Jesus himself gathered a group of followers and called them to be salt and light (Matt 5:13-16), to be good news and to share his love with everyone by being connected to him and one another. He later told them, I am the vine, you are the branches - remain in my love, and love one another (John 15:1-17). The early church leader, Paul, wrote many letters to the churches, and he used the words, "one another" over and over, to reinforce this idea of community and connection. "One another" are two words in English, but it's only one word in Greek: άλλήλων (ah-LAY-loan), the common language at the time when the New Testament was written. "One another" is used 100 times in 94 New Testament verses. 47 of those verses give instructions to the church, and 60% of those instructions come from Paul.

"No man is an island," as the poem by John Donne put it. A reminder that we need other people to grow, not just in families and as part of society, but also, if we are going to flourish as individuals, and to develop a living faith from a soul that is at peace. In our day, we can sometimes feel alone with the pressures of daily life. This is where the church can help and our Sunday worship provides a context to spill out our concerns to God, to find comfort

and direction in meeting the challenges of life with faith, and in the context of a loving and prayerful community, which is our Binsey Mission Community.

Following on from the encouragement of our Team Rector in last month's Binsey Link, please come and join us at a time and place that meets your needs. The service times What we see is not always what are published in the Link each month, and you are more than welcome to pop in during the week at one of our scheduled services, and Wednesday midday prayers. We have also devised walks to and from these churches and maps are available inside. We do hope you will also take a few minutes or longer to take a pew, to have a moment of quiet reflection, and perhaps, shelter from pelting rain outside!

> The poet, Francis Thomson, a former student from my first Theological College, spoke of God as, "the hound of heaven." A God who seeks us out in love, and never loses the trail. However, I repeat, there is no Beast of Binsey prowling our fields, but there are plenty of worries and pressures on our tail, so to speak, in the hustle and bustle of life in 2020. Why not pencil in a morning or afternoon, to come into one of our lovely churches? Time to paws for thought, and for the Lord.

The North Lakes Foodbank have been helping people in our region since 2009. It is part of the Trussell Trust, a Christian led charitable organization who help with the foodbank's administration, to enable them to focus on the increasing day to day needs of vulnerable people in West Cumbria and North Lakes.

Over 150 professional and public sector bodies help to give vouchers to people assessed as in need. The foodbanks provide healthy well-balanced food packs for individuals and families to sustain them temporarily during difficult and stressful events. In their collection point cafes they provide a non-judgmental welcome, a hot drink, cake and can help signpost people in need to the organisations that can provide longer term assistance Additionally, The North Lakes Foodbank provides 'Lunch Packs 4 Kids' to ensure that vulnerable children are fed during school holiday periods. Finally, they also provide life skills and educational assistance to help children learn money wise practices and how to cook healthily on a budget. Last year 3201 vouchers were fulfilled, 6281 people were fed, 2052 of these were children! The need for the foodbank's assistance has been rising about 20% for the past couple of years.

School News

Ireby School

Visit to the Lowry Museum - "On Wednesday 22nd January, we travelled by minibus to the Lowry Museum in Salford to learn about the life and work of LS Lowry. We were lucky enough to have an art workshop by professional artist, Paul Pickford, who showed us around the Lowry Galleries and helped us learn about some of Lowry's Industrial paintings, because we are finding out about the Industrial Revolution in our class. Paul taught us how to sketch like Lowry and we copied one of his paintings called "Going to the Match". The people in the painting are in the shape of the Union Jack flag because Lowry painted it for the Queen. We also learned how to draw portraits by sketching one called "Head of a Man", which is a self-portrait by Lowry, drawn the day after his mother died. We had a great day and finished it off with a visit to the Blue Peter Garden and Media City, where the BBC and ITV studios are. We saw the trams and the Chinese Lanterns around the Blue Peter Garden to celebrate Chinese New Year." by James Cox. Y3. Back in the classroom the KS2 pupils were visited by Chris Wadsworth, an expert on Percy Kelly and LS Lowry, who delivered an art and drama workshop based around Lowry's "Matchstick figures". A local artist, Caroline McKenzie, also came into the KS2 class to help the children create portraits of one of the characters from the class text, "Street Child". The KS2 children are visiting Beamish Museum soon, where they will carry out a Local History Enquiry to investigate life as a child working in the mines during the Industrial Revolution era. The EYFS / KS1 class have started an inter-school connection with Islamabad Convent School in Pakistan. The children had their first FaceTime talk with their teacher, they asked many questions and hope to learn languages with them and do international projects together. The infant children are still enjoying learning about Inventions and Explorers and have been carrying out some of their own experiments. Last week, they had a very busy weeklong science experiment based around the question, "Why do we need to wash our hands?" They have asked many big questions about germs and mould and have found out many interesting things. Some of their findings (involving the spread of germs and mould on bread) can be seen on our Twitter feed and on our school website as well as many of our other events and activities.

Blennerhasset School

February was, as usual, a busy month for Blennerhasset School. Although the weather in February rarely gives us the opportunity to spend too much time in outdoor activities, we appear to have used those opportunities to the full this year. As if to emphasise that, we had a visit from the Police Community Support Officer to talk about road safety. This is always important for children who live in a rural environment, who perhaps may not be as used to the dangers of fast-moving vehicles as those living in town. However, we know that our villages are not safe from speeding cars, and the warnings are very much required.

The children enjoyed a session of 'wheelchair basketball' with Nat Pattinson. Himself a wheelchair user, Nat visits us with 12 wheelchairs, so that the children can engage in an activity, which as well as making a popular sport available to all children, enables them to experience the difficulties that others may encounter.

Years 5 & 6 took part in a technology day at Beacon Hill, where they had the opportunity to design and make items using a 3D printer. We like to take every chance to mix with pupils from other schools, particularly when it involves an introduction to modern technology! Bright Stars is a competition organised by Cumbrian Centre for Leadership Performance, aimed at primary schools to inspire entrepreneurship. Years 3 & 4 have been super busy with Sealy UK discussing our ideas and sharing our vision for a successful project.

At Sealy, zero waste goes to landfill so they are keen for us to consider using some of the recyclable materials to create some products for Bright Stars that we can sell. The children are now making bags from the waste material which you will soon be able to purchase. You can find out more about Bright Stars at

It has been an enjoyable start to the spring term.

Year 5 and 6 have had four weeks of training to become 'Young Sports Leaders'. They all passed and are looking forward to beginning their activities with the rest of the children at breaktimes. Children in Year 4, 5 & 6 have been enjoying their tennis tuition led by Rob Jefferson.

Our infant children are having kinder cricket lessons with Chris Hodgson and enjoyed their workshops on 'Farm to Fork' at Walby Farm.

Our junior science lessons began with a workshop from the geologist, Stephen Wright, on Rocks and Soils, and we particularly enjoyed making volcanoes and handling all the different types of rocks.

There are many interesting things about snowdrops, here are just three of them:

- 1. Did you know that snowdrops are used in medicine to help people? Galamantine extracted from snowdrops is now used in a treatment to slow down dementia in Alzheimer's disease.
- 2. Snowdrop's contain a natural anti-freeze. Even if they collapse in freezing weather they recover once the temperature rises.
- 3. Snowdrop pollen and nectar is an early spring feast for many bees. The green stripes inside the snowdrops are like landing lights guiding them to one of the only restaurants open this early in the season.




