### **Rest and Recovery**

We have enjoyed the Olympics and now the Paralympics. Quite a haul of medals and stories to inspire and cheer us up. There are lessons to apply to our lives from how the athletes achieve and even fail well!

Some of the things athletes often say is that they could not have made it without training hard and with support from others - but also, afterwards —taking the time to recover and rest. I find it interesting that it's not merely rest that is needed, but also recovery time.

In our day and age, the need for rest and recovery is more acute than ever, with 24/7 shopping, remote working, and an overload of information, while juggling all this, and trying to look good, too!

Most of us understand the need to take a break - others are craving one. Others are used to pushing on and through, regardless of the stresses and cost. However, this is where we can find ourselves in trouble. The fittest of us still need to take care before, during, and after exerting ourselves. We would be wise to do the same when it comes to the strains and anxieties of our own lives internally as well. Whether it be a family crisis, ongoing care needs, hassle at work, or something else.

Jesus told the people of his day - under occupation by Rome, riven by revolutions and factions, overloaded with rules, and exploited all the same - to 'come to him and find rest for their souls. To take up his yoke, and to learn from him'. Primarily, this was an invitation to depart from highly legalistic and predatory forms of religion and into the heart of a loving God - full of compassion for the downtrodden and abused, but also offering a way out for the proud and profane. Rather than leave their faith, it was to put goodness back in! To become whole in relations to God, themselves, and others.

A yoke [from a similar word-root as 'yoga'] teams up two animals - e.g., horses, cows, or oxen - in order to plough straight. It combines their strength, allowing them tomove at the same pace. Jesus was enjoining the people to come alongside him - to know his love, to follow in the ways of wisdom even more than truth - of Spirit, as well as The Word of God. In our day, we too need such things.. There is information galore, but not much wisdom on offer. We may be materially well-off, but we are time-poor.



Jesus said: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." Matt 11:28-30; [NIV]

Take it from me - Jesus' way is a better way. Nurturing our souls with what is good by simplifying our lives, slowing them down, working on the crooked parts bit-by-bit, and making space for rest and recovery, is good advice. Sometimes, less really is more.

### **Baptism in the Binsey Team Mission Community**

We are really pleased when parents approach us about Baptism (also known as Christening) for their child. It's a very important step, both for parents and the child. Infant Baptism involves parents and godparents making a public commitment about their own Christian faith and the church. They are making a commitment to pray for their child, so that as they grow, with their help, and ours, they may be able to live out in practice the Christian life.

To enable parents to do this we ask that you come and join us in worship at any of our team churches at some point in the two months BEFORE the date of the baptism, if possible. After an enquiry is made, a home visit will be arranged to discuss things informally, to see what level of preparation might be appropriate and answer any questions.

We are delighted to be conducting Baptisms again, and most of the restrictions have now been eased, but face masks are still required to worn in church, when arriving and leaving, and can only be removed once seated. At this stage we are still looking to restrict the size of the baptism party with the number of people allowed to attend appropriate to the size of each church.

### Binsey History by Mick Jane

### Re-opening of St. Bega's Church Bassenthwaite Parish Church in October 1874

On Thursday, the 1<sup>st</sup> October 1874, the ancient Parish Church of Bassenthwaite was re-opened, after undergoing part restoration, but in the main a rebuilding, all at the cost to H. A. Spedding, Esq., of Mirehouse and family, assisted by the voluntary contributions of a few friends.


The Church, which is undoubtedly of ancient origin, had suffered severely from effects of time, and the ruthless hand of past ages of churchwardens. Although by no means rich in architectural details, its rude but quaint interior, and the graceful external proportion of its original parts, render it a picturesque and interesting object as it stands by the margin of the lake, in one of the most beautiful parts of our Lakeland scenery.

The Lord Bishop of the Diocese preached a forcible service and, as may be judged from the words of his text "Old and new," he was in the highest degree happy in the application of his subject to the fabric of the church then reopened, and to the special circumstances of the parish, but mainly to the history and present position of the Established Church. Mr. Bowstead Esq., of Armathwaite Hall, presided at the harmonium (a very fine one of his own, lent for the occasion) and conducted the choir, trained under his own direction, and the musical part of the service was, for real excellence, such as is rarely heard in a country church. A handsome oak pulpit, with three stone bases, has been presented by Wm. Denton, Esq., as a memorial to the late John Spedding Esq., a polished brass lectern, by J. W. Oddie, Esq.; a cedar alter table, by the Rev. A. Hedlam; a new Bible for the lectern, by a lady; and alter cover and step cushions of handsome needlework, by Mrs. and the Misses Spedding.

In connection with the restoration, special reference must be made to the stained-glass window, placed in the east end chancel, by public subscriptions, as a memorial to the late T. S. Spedding, of Mirehouse, to commemorate his worth as a local gentleman, and an active and leading county magistrate.

The above article is part of the opening ceremony which took part in 1874. The church stands in a most beautiful spot in the Mirehouse grounds, overlooking Lake Bassenthwaite, the only true lake in the district. If you are new to the area the church is well worth a visit, and is about a 15 minute walk from either Scarness Lane or Dodd Wood. It was a place we visited soon after moving to the Lake District some thirty years ago. The atmosphere of the place has stayed with us ever since.




